Box Tops for Education

Purchase: General Mills products, including Cheerios, Hamburger Helper and Kleenex

What they're worth: 10 cents each

What to do: Cut out the Box Top for Education logo and bring to Riverview, Horizon, Fairview or Parkview office

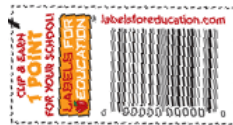


Labels for Education

Purchase: Campbell's products, including Campbell's soups, SpaghettiOs, Pepperidge Farm products (including Goldfish crackers), Swanson broths, V-8 beverages and Prego pasta sauce

What they're worth: Credit for school equipment and supplies

What to do: Cut designated labels and bring to Riverview, Horizon, Fairview or Parkview office



Nickels for Schools

Purchase: Marked Kemps and Golden Guernsey milk

What they're worth: 5 cents each

What to do: Bring milk caps to Horizon, Fairview or Parkview office



Tyson Project A+ Labels

Purchase: Marked Tyson Foods bagged and boxed products

What they're worth: 24 cents each

What to do: Bring the label to Horizon office



Old cell phones and inkjet printer cartridges

What to do: Bring them to Horizon, Fairview or Parkview office

Market Day

Purchase: Your choice of more than 160 food and household items from www.marketday.com

What it's worth: Designated school gets 10% of the proceeds

What to do: Get an order form from the main office at Horizon or Fairview, then pick up your monthly order when it arrives

Kwip Trip Scrip

Purchase: Gift cards at Parkview

What they're worth: School gets a 5% discount

Pick-N-Save We Care Program

Purchase: Groceries at Pick-N-Save

What it's worth: Schools get a portion of your purchases

What to do: Register your Advantage Plus card at the service desk (use code 336750 for Horizon, 221225 for Fairview, 606500 for Parkview)

Target Take Charge of Education

Purchase: Anything at Target using your REDcard credit or check card

What it's worth: Designated school gets 1% of your purchases

What to do: Designate Horizon, Fairview or Parkview as your beneficiary at target.com/tcoe

Subway School Rewards

Purchase: Food at Subway using cards linked to the school of your choice

What it's worth: Designated school gets 2% of your purchases

What to do: Contact offices at Fairview or Riverview to get a card or link an existing card at schoolPAX.org, then add cash at any Subway

Where: Horizon, Fairview

How you can help:

Noon recess helpers

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Assist teachers and aides with recess supervision

Time commitment: During recess; can sign up for specific days

Notes: Can bring younger children

Assemble Fri. Folders

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Assemble the packets that go home with elementary students

Time commitment: 8:45 to 10 a.m. usually on Fridays; may be needed 1 or 2 times per month

Notes: Can bring younger children

Library helper

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Shelving books that have been returned

Time commitment: Flexible during school day

Yearbook helper

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Help take photos of students in the classroom, on the playground and at events and field trips throughout the year; assist in cover contest and with orders and distribution

Time commitment: 1-2 hours per month, more in the spring

Market Day helpers

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Help sort Market Day orders and place in boxes

Time commitment: 2:15 to 3:30 p.m. first Friday of the month

Notes: Can bring younger children

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Help nurse screen students' vision

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Sell Scholastic books before and after school and during some evenings

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Volunteers weigh and measure all children

Where: Fairview

What's involved: Donate food items and help sell food at event a few days before school starts
